## Canada and Manitoba invest in water infrastructure upgrades

Joint federal, provincial, and municipal funding through the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) will support four projects in Manitoba. These projects will upgrade water infrastructure to improve system efficiency and protect local communities and environments. The Government of Canada is investing more than \$22.7 million in these projects through ICIP's Green Infrastructure Stream. The Manitoba government is providing more than \$19.5 million. Contributions from project proponents total more than \$12.7 million.
