Manitoba is strategically located

- We are the geographical centre of North America with connections to 410 million people in Canada, the United States and Mexico.
 Manitoba is a major hub for a solid transportation network that spans North America including key highways, three class one railways and an international airport.
- Goods from Winnipeg (Manitoba's capital city) can reach anywhere in the world within 48 hours.
- CentrePort Canada is Manitoba's inland port and foreign trade zone with ample industrial land that provides companies with easy access to transportation links.

Recent food processing investments in Manitoba include:

- J.R. Simplot's \$460 million potato processing expansion in Portage la Prairie
- Roquette's \$400 million pea processing plant in Portage la Prairie
- HyLife's \$105 million pork processing expansion in Neepawa
- Parmalat's \$50 million fluid milk plant in Winnipeg

Agricultural food and manufacturing are key to Manitoba's economy

• Since 2016, Manitoba had \$1.2 billion in investments in the food and agri-product processing sector. There are projections of approximately \$1.1 billion in investments in the next several years.

 Agriculture and food production in Manitoba represent about 5.7 per cent of the provincial economy. One in 17 jobs depends on direct spinoffs from agriculture.

- In 2017, total sales in food manufacturing were \$4.7 billion, representing nearly 25 per cent of Manitoba's total manufacturing sales.

 handling and storage exports –
 exporting to over 50 countries.

- In 2017, Manitoba's food manufacturing exports were approximately \$2.7 billion.
- We have a vibrant food processing sector that is comprised of over 378 provincially and 131 federally inspected facilities.





Manitoba offers exciting opportunities and clear advantages in research and development

- The Food Development Centre is a world class, federally licensed, research and development centre. It provides state-of-the art resources and expertise to clients who are developing and producing innovative food products for local and global markets.
- The Canadian Centre for Agri-Food Research in Health and Medicine studies the health benefits of nutraceuticals, natural health products and functional foods.
- The Richardson Centre for Functional Foods and Nutraceuticals studies bio-active compounds in prairie crops and how they affect human health.
- The Canadian International Grains Institute offers clients technical expertise in milling, baking and processing grains, oilseeds, pulses and special crops.
- The Composites Innovation Centre helps companies commercialize natural fibre composite products.

Manitoba is the economic centre for the western Canadian grain industry and has additional advantages including:

- major manufacturers of quality agricultural equipment and machinery
- total agricultural land potential of approximately 17.5 million acres (11 per cent) in the province
- major food processors in potatoes, pork, chicken, turkey and dairy
- hydroelectricity rates among the lowest in the world
- headquarters for Cargill Canada, Richardson International,
 Parrish and Heimbecker, Paterson Grain and G3 Canada

MANITOBA'S PRODUCTION STATISTICS

Manitoba produces diverse commodities that are key to further processing, including approximately:

- 100 per cent of Canada's sunflower seeds
- 29 per cent of Canada's soybeans
- 26 per cent of Canada's sows
- 24 per cent of Canada's total pork production
- 22 per cent of Canada's oats
- 21 per cent of Canada's potatoes
- 15 per cent of Canada's wheat
- 15 per cent of Canada's canola
- 12 per cent of Canada's beef cows
- 8 per cent of Canada's flax seed
- 6 per cent of Canada's barley
- 120 varieties of vegetables

Manitoba also supports:

- major crops of corn, mustard seed, hemp, buckwheat, canary seed and pulses
- a dairy industry with major genetic exports throughout the world
