The Pas Correctional Centre

The Pas Correctional Centre is a medium security facility located next to the Provincial Court Building in The Pas, Manitoba. It houses about 114 sentenced and remanded adult male offenders, and up to six adult female offenders. There is also a six-person housing unit for young offenders and a special handling unit for higher security offenders.

Programs

Correctional staff focus on offenders' personal development through group interaction, educational opportunities, vocational training, work experience and individual counselling. These programs are offered at The Pas:

- domestic violence intervention
- anger management
- addictions recovery
- recreation and crafts
- Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous
- Culturally Appropriate Program

Correctional officers, chaplains and liaison staff facilitate programs and case counselling. Correctional officers also supervise indoor and outdoor recreation.

Work Programs

Offenders can earn valuable work experience in the following areas:

- kitchen work
- grounds keeping and gardening
- housekeeping


Other Activities

Chaplain services and Aboriginal spirituality are provided through agreements with local churches and Aboriginal spiritual caregivers.

Staff

Staff include correctional officers, trades instructors, nurses, chaplains, Aboriginal spiritual caregivers, managers and administrative staff. Correctional officers work 12-hour shifts, providing 24-hour coverage seven days per week.

Corrections staff must work as part of a team, using sound judgment and a mature, common-sense approach to decision-making and inmate interventions. Candidates will take the correctional officer/juvenile counsellors screening tests. The tests assess written skills, problem-solving and decision-making abilities, judgement and other personal characteristics important for correctional staff.



If you are selected for correctional officer/
juvenile counsellor training, you must:

- Submit a recent Criminal Records Search Certificate.*
- Submit Child Abuse and Adult Abuse Registry Checks.
- Submit Emergency or Standard First Aid and CPR Level C certificates.
- Have a valid Manitoba Class 5F driver's licence.
- Meet medical fitness requirements.

* A previous criminal record does not necessarily mean a person cannot become a correctional officer/juvenile counsellor — it will depend on the nature of the offence and how long ago the offence was committed. You may apply for a pardon if you meet the requirements.
