The following petitions were presented and read:

Mrs. ROWAT – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government and the Minister of Children and Youth Opportunities to ensure that the rights of all Manitoba children are respected and that the opinions of children are taken into consideration when decisions that affect them are made and to correct the tragic systemic flaws that have failed Manitoba children in the recent past. (K. Beaulieu, S. Becenko, T. Martindale and others)

Mr. SCHULER – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge that the Provincial Government improve the safety at the pedestrian corridor at the intersection of PTH# 206 and Cedar Avenue in Oak Bank by considering such steps as highlighting pavement markings to better indicate the location of the shoulders and crosswalk, as well as installing a lighted crosswalk structure. Mr. EWASKO – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government and the Minister of Health to ensure that the Beausejour District Hospital and Primary Care Centre have a primary care physician available on weekends and holidays to better provide area residents with this essential service. Mr. GRAYDON – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to consider immediately enacting a province wide review of the long-term care needs of residents of Manitoba and to recognize the stresses placed upon the healthcare system by the current and continuous aging population and consider increasing the availability of long-term care spaces (PCH beds) in communities across the province. Ms. HOWARD, Chairperson of the Committee of Supply, presented the Report of the Proceedings of the Committee of June 24, 2015 as follows:

IN THE COMMITTEE

The following Resolutions were adopted:

RESOLVED that a sum not exceeding \$9,473,621,000 being 75% of the total amount to be voted as set forth in Part A (Operating Expenditure) of the Estimates, be granted to Her Majesty for the Fiscal Year ending the 31st day of March, 2016.

RESOLVED that a sum not exceeding \$675,631,000 being 90% of the total amount to be voted as set out in Part B (Capital Investment) of the Estimates, be granted to Her Majesty for the Fiscal Year ending the 31st day of March, 2016.

Resolutions were reported and the Report was received.

Hon. Mr. DEWAR moved:

THAT there be granted to Her Majesty on account of Certain Expenditures of the Public Service for the Fiscal Year ending March 31, 2016 out of the Consolidated Fund, the sums of \$9,473,621,000 being 75% of the total amount to be voted as set out in Part A (Operating Expenditure) and \$675,631,000 being 90% of the total amount to be voted as set out in Part B (Capital Investment) of the estimates, laid before the House at the present Session of the Legislature.

And the Question being put. It was agreed to.

On motion of Hon. Mr. DEWAR, Bill (No. 44) – The Interim Appropriation Act, 2015/Loi de 2015 portant affectation anticipée de crédits, was read a First Time and ordered for Second Reading immediately.

Hon. Mr. DEWAR moved:

THAT Bill (No. 44) – The Interim Appropriation Act, 2015/Loi de 2015 portant affectation anticipée de crédits, be now read a Second Time, and be referred to Committee of the Whole.

And Hon. Mr. DEWAR and Mr. FRIESEN having spoken,

And the Question being put. It was agreed to.

The Bill was accordingly read a Second Time and referred to Committee of the Whole.

The House resolving into Committee of the Whole.
