Pursuant to Rule 27(1), Hon. Ms. SQUIRES, Messrs. SWAN and NESBITT, Ms. FONTAINE and Mrs. GUILLEMARD made Members' Statements.

The following petitions were presented and read:

Hon. Mr. FLETCHER – Legislative Assembly of Manitoba to urge the Provincial Government to take the necessary steps to ensure that the Vimy Arena site is not used for an addiction treatment facility and to take the necessary steps to ensure the preservation of public land along Sturgeon Creek for the purposes of park land and recreational activities for public use (including being an important component of the Sturgeon Creek Greenway Trail and the Sturgeon Creek ecosystem) under the current designation of PR2 for the 255 Hamilton Avenue location at the Vimy Arena site, and to maintain the land to continue to be designated for Parks and Recreation Active Neighbourhood/Community.

In accordance with Rule 29, Hon. Mr. GERRARD rose on a Grievance.

The House resumed the debate on the Proposed Motion of Hon. Mr. EICHLER:

THAT Bill (No. 35) – The Crown Lands Amendment Act (Improved Management of Community Pastures and Agricultural Crown Lands)/Loi modifiant la Loi sur les terres domaniales (gestion améliorée des pâturages communautaires et des terres domaniales agricoles), reported from the Standing Committee on Social and Economic Development, be concurred in and be now read a Third Time and passed.

The Bill was accordingly concurred in, read a Third Time and passed.

Hon. Mrs. COX moved:

THAT Bill (No. 8) – The Government Notices Modernization Act (Various Acts Amended)/Loi sur la modernisation de la publication des avis du gouvernement (modification de diverses lois), reported from the Standing Committee on Social and Economic Development, be concurred in and be now read a Third Time and passed.

THAT Bill (No. 16) – The Climate and Green Plan Implementation Act/Loi sur la mise en œuvre du Plan vert et climatique, reported from the Standing Committee on Legislative Affairs, and subsequently amended, be concurred in and be now read a Third Time and passed.

And Hon. Ms. SQUIRES, Hon. Mr. GERRARD, Mr. ALTEMAYER and Hon. Mr. FLETCHER having spoken,

Hon. Mr. FLETCHER asked Written Questions (Nos. 10, 11 and 12) for reply to the following:

10. Can the Provincial Government provide all the empirical and scientific evidence from Manitoba Hydro, or other government bodies, to support its claim that demand side management (DSM), as proposed in the Efficiency Manitoba legislation, will in any way reduce greenhouse gas emissions in the generation of electricity and does the Provincial Government agree that the DSM program for electric power generation will cost Manitoba Hydro billions of dollars over time?
 11. Can the Provincial Government provide the correspondence that initiated the one dollar transaction between the City of Winnipeg (City) and the MLA for Kirkfield Park on behalf of the province via the Manitoba Housing and Renewal Corporation that requires the City to sell the 255 Hamilton Avenue site (also known as the Vimy Arena), including the letter of intent, any correspondence, emails, notes, along with timelines and dates?
 12. Having failed to address conflict of interest issues and the public interest, will the Provincial Government table legislation immediately that would take effect before the end of the legislative session in the Spring and include the Conflict of Interest Commissioner's 83 recommendations?
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The House then adjourned at 5:00 p.m. until 10:00 a.m. Thursday, November 8, 2018.
